Missing its top two scorers to injury, host Algonquin was still able to build a three-goal lead in 45 minutes to post a non-league win over Westborough, 3-1.

Goals by Matt Hanley and Max Andrews gave the Tomahawks a 2-0 halftime lead. Five minutes after the break, Brendan McGill set up Patrick Keller for the final tally, pushing Algonquin to 9-2-3.

Baran Cansever made four saves to get the win in the T-Hawk net, with Chris Salvadore the only Ranger to beat him. Westborough is now 6-7-2.

LINCOLN-SUDBURY 1, ACTON-BOXBORO 1: Jake Hart gave host Acton-Boxboro the lead with 10 minutes left, but Nick Addeo and Lincoln-Sudbury had the final say - tying up this Dual County League clash with a minute left. The Colonials (8-0-6, 5-0-2) own a two-point lead in the Large Division with one match left. L-S moved to 6-5-4 overall with the point, needing just two more points to get into the tournament.

WELLESLEY 2, MANSFIELD 2:

Matt Gibbs scored on a free kick in the 55th minute, pulling Wellesley even in its non-league tilt with Mansfield. Jet Gray got the Raiders (6-6-3) on the board in the 33rd minute by scoring on Ryan O'Malley's assist. With top defender Andy Beimford out, stopper Jeremy Luck and sweeper Mike Kyrios had solid games for Wellesley.

VALLEY TECH 2, SHAWSHEEN 1:

Brain Swindell had a goal and an assist to lead Valley Tech to a win over previously undefeated Shawsheen (9-1-5) in a non-league game. Nate Cote also scored for the Beavers (13-1-2, 9-0-1 CAL).

HOLBROOK 2, TRI-COUNTY 1:

Jake Crowley's penalty kick goal was not enough for visiting Tri-County to upset undefeated Holbrook in a Mayflower Small League game. Goalkeeper Sean Dorsey had an outstanding game for the Cougars (4-9-2, 4-6-2 MS), and was helped by the stellar defensive trio of Andrew Gregg, Cullen Weatherell and Josh Strom. Senior captain Tyler Strom also had a great game, drawing the penalty kick on which Crowley scored.
