Adam Skaggs had a goal and an assist to help host Framingham prevail in convincing fashion against previously unbeaten Weymouth, 5-1, in a Bay State Conference game.

The Flyers (4-0, 3-0 BSC) led 2-0 at halftime and did not look back as they continue their perfect start. Ronaldo Viera started the scoring early with a goal in the second minute and Erick Nader added the other first half score.

Framingham jumped to a 4-0 lead in the second half on goals by Skaggs and Marlon Ramalho before the teams traded goals late. John Goncalves had the Flyers' final tally and Jake Bristol had Weymouth's (4-1-0, 3-1-0 BSC) lone score. Luca Pignatiello had five saves in net for Framingham.

WALPOLE 2, NATICK 1:

Senior Max Donahue scored from Rei Mitsuyama at 28:13, but visiting Walpole tied the game in the first half and then won it with 2:14 remaining on an indirect kick by Scott Bradbury as Natick dropped the Bay State Conference contest. The Redmen (1-3, 1-2) hit the crossbar with under a minute remaining in regulation.

MARLBOROUGH 6, WESTBOROUGH 1:

Senior Flavio Pereira scored three times for visiting Marlborough in a decisive Mid-Wach B victory over host Westborough.

Pereira scored two of his three in the first half, giving the Panthers the advantage at the break. Senior Ryan Ruffing (1-4-0, 0-2-0 MWB) pulled the Rangers within a goal nine minutes into the second frame, but Marlborough (2-1-1, 2-0-1 MWB) senior Louis Saguich netted the third Panther goal less than a minute later.

Wagner Rosa and senior Martin Van Ess connected on a corner kick to give in the Panthers a 4-1 edge. Pereira added an assist midway through the second half, feeding Jimmy Goncalves, then grabbed his hat trick.
