## Colonials, C-C tie

CONCORD - As scoreless ties go, this one was pretty eventful.

After 80 minutes on Friday afternoon, defending MIAA Division 2 boys soccer champion Concord-Carlisle and defending Dual County League co-champion Acton-Boxborough both left the field with their undefeated records intact, playing to a scoreless tie after each team's goalies and defenses turned away several scoring chances.

"It was a very well-played game," said A-B coach David Baumritter. "We've always had good games with Concord-Carlisle."

The Colonials had the bulk of the scoring chances in the first half, placing eight shots on net to C-C's three, while the Patriots had a 5-2 edge in the second half.

"It was a good soccer match," said C-C coach Ray Pavlik. "Both goalies made some great saves. Our chances were limited in the first half and I'm happy with the way our guys responded in the second half."

Fourteen minutes into the second half, C-C's Theo Terris had his team's best chance of the game, placing a high shot on the Colonials' net, which A-B goalie D.J. Brock tipped over the crossbar.

"Theo is a great player," Brock said. "He got off a good shot and I had to react. I'm glad I was able to get a hand on it."

The Colonials' best chance of the first half came with about three minutes left before intermission. Dan Sincavage placed a header that hit the post.

With less than a minute left in the game, Jake Hart got off a shot that went just high of the C-C net.

James Smith made 10 saves for C-C.
