Golfers swing back into tourney

The Acton-Boxborough golf team will be playing in the postseason for the first time since 2004.

Tuesday afternoon, A-B improved to 11-6 with an 88-47 victory over Boston Latin.

Junior Kip Webber led the Colonials with 16 points. Freshman Mike Souliotis, Scott DiCicco, Dave Cremen and John Piantedosi scored 11 points each.

"It's nice to win 11," said A-B coach John Carco. "That's more than we've won in the last two years combined."

The Acton-Boxborough girls soccer team continued its dominance with a 2-0 victory over Wachusett Regional in a non-league game on Sunday.

Lindsay Raymond scored an unassisted goal in the 11th minute and in the 46th, Ceci Jensen picked up her fifth goal in the last four games, with Cassie Wagner earning the assist.

A-B improved to 11-0 (9-0 in the Dual County League).
