Sophomore Jenna DiCicco scored an unassisted goal, her first varsity goal ever, to lead visiting Lincoln-Sudbury over host Bedford. Goalkeeper Kathleen Davis collected her seventh shutout of the season for the Warriors (7-3-2), while junior Brianna Miller and sophomore Kate Sisk both had strong games for L-S.

FRANKLIN 3, CANTON 0: Host Franklin took the lead early, and Kelly Meredith and Mel Otocky split time in goal to shut out Hockomock League opponent Canton. Caileigh Grove scored the difference-maker for the Panthers (5-5-2, 5-4-2 HL) 15 minutes into the match, and Elyse Brightman and Stephanie Soma also scored.

UXBRIDGE 4, AUBURN 2: Uxbridge overcame an early deficit as Stephanie Seagrave scored two goals in a road win over Southern Worcester County League rival Auburn.
