## Field hockey team ties Lincoln-Sudbury

In an attempt to avenge its only loss of the season, the Acton-Boxborough field hockey team played to a scoreless tie with Lincoln-Sudbury on Tuesday.

Haley O'Brien placed a shot into the top of the Warriors' net, but the goal was disallowed and the Colonials were awarded a corner on the play. A-B (7-1-2) placed 16 shots on net to L-S's four.

"It was a pretty even game," said A-B coach Mae Shoemaker. "It went back and forth and we came alive with 10 minutes left."

Monday afternoon, A-B pulled out a 2-1 victory over Wayland. After the Warriors took an early lead, Haley O'Brien scored with an assist from Alexa Sikalis. Giselle Schlegel scored the second goal with two minutes left in the first half.

"I'm proud of the girls for not getting down after Wayland scored first," Shoemaker said. "Being able to come back was good."

On Saturday, the Colonials shut out Westford Academy, 4-0. Schlegel scored two goals. Maggie Ashton contributed a goal and an assist. O'Brien also scored. Sikalis, Devon Agule and Erin Murphy chipped in with assists.

Hayley Brock scored a hat trick in the Acton-Boxborough girls soccer team's 5-0 victory over Concord-Carlisle on Friday.

Brock scored her first goal on a penalty kick and added two goals in the second half, with assists from Cassie Wagner and Martha Dane. Brock also assisted on a goal from Lindsay Raymond six minutes into the game.

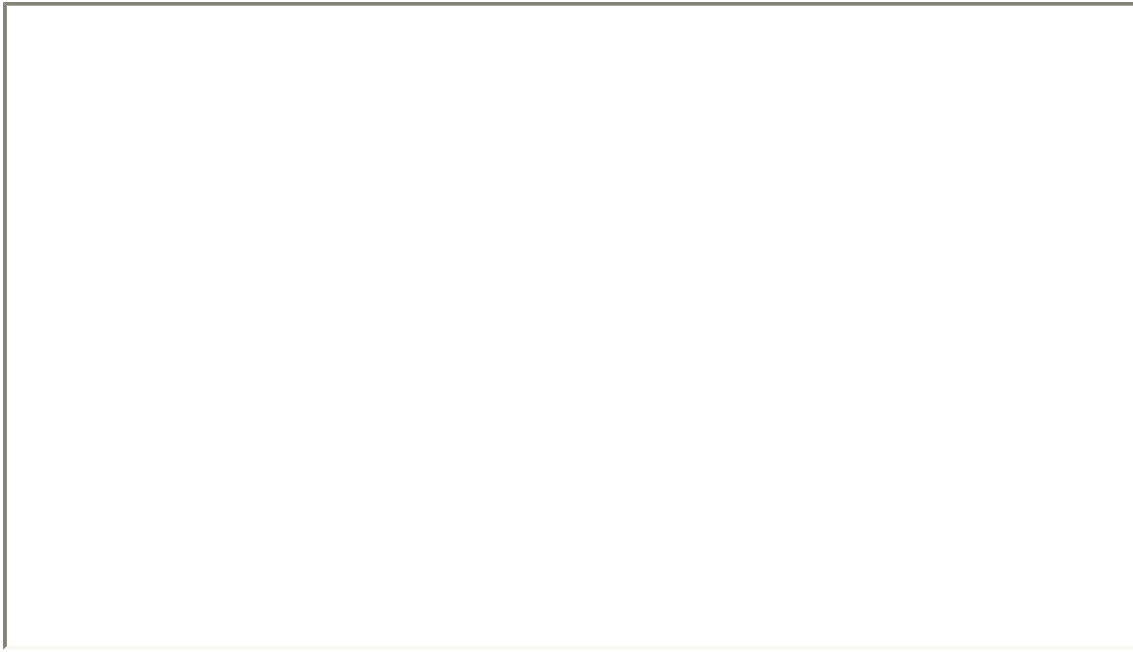
Charlotte Davis capped off the scoring in the 63<sup>rd</sup> minute.
